## Preparing Your Home for the Market

Most potential buyers will know in a very short period of time whether your home is the right one for them or not. ## Interior

- Declutter and organize closets and cabinets so there is some space not being used
- Make any needed minor repairs such as dripping faucets, loose knobs, doors that stick, ripped screens, missing caulk, etc.
- Remove unnecessary furniture from the house
- Paint any walls that aren't a neutral color
- Declutter shelves and bookcases by removing at least half of what's there.
- Remove all magnets and photos from the refrigerator
- Remove all religious and political items, family photos, trophies, and mounted animal heads
- Replace all compact florescent bulbs with bright incandescent bulbs
- Clean the whole house but in particular wash all windows, clean all light fixtures, and shampoo the carpets
- Every home with a basement in Minnesota needs a dehumidifier

## **Exterior**

- Power wash the house. Scrape and repaint any peeling paint
- Clean all rain gutters; ensure all downspout extensions are in place
- Pay special attention to the front door and entryway; hardware nice? Needs paint? Clean? Welcome mat attractive?
- Have something attractive in terra-cotta pots by the front door; geraniums in summer, pine tops in winter.
- Prune back any overgrown shrubs, weed the flower beds, cut the lawn.

## Garage

- Ensure the main garage door, opener and remotes work properly
- Clean oil spots from floor, then sweep and wash with detergent
- Put the brightest bulbs possible in the fixtures
- Clean all cobwebs and insects from corners, wash windows
- Hang up all hoses, bicycles and garden tools
- Organize your holiday decorations and toys (plastic tubs?)
- Clean out the garbage container so it doesn't smell
